## **Celebrating Black History** Month in Video

Are you looking for a film to watch for Black History Month? The USA Libraries have you covered with a variety of streaming video resources to help you celebrate the month and learn about the achievements of Black Americans. Here are some recommendations:

bell hooks: Cultural Criticism & **Transformation**: In this video, bell hooks discusses what she views as the power of cultural criticism to transform passive viewers into enlightened witnesses of entertainment. Watch via **Kanopy**.

Black Panthers: Vanguard of the **Revolution:** This PBS documentary covers the history of the Black Panthers from the points of view of those involved, including police informants, supporters, and detractors.





The Ferry: A Civil Rights Story

Isaac Pope: The Spirit of an American Century

I Am Not Your Negro: This Oscarnominated documentary, narrated by Samuel Jackson, focuses on James Baldwin and a book he never finished – a personal account of the assassinations of Martin Luther King, Jr., Medgar Evers, and Malcom X. Watch via Kanopy.

True Justice: Bryan Stevenson's **Fight for Equality**: Bryan Stevenson is the author of Just Mercy (USA's 2018-2019 Common Read book), the founder of the Equal Justice Initiative, and the force behind the establishment of the Legacy Museum in Montgomery, AL. This HBO documentary discusses Stevenson's career as a defense lawyer on capital cases and his work for a more equitable justice system. Watch via Swank.

Winnersville: This documentary looks at

All University of South Alabama faculty, staff, and students are now able to access the current edition of *The New York Times* along with the archives going back to 1851. Access also includes the NYT apps on smartphones or tablets, and *The New York Times* videos and podcasts.

To create an account and gain access, go to the Marx Library's <u>Databases & e-Reference</u> page and choose *New York Times Digital Edition*. You'll be taken to a page asking you to search for your school. Once you choose the University of South Alabama, you'll see a page with instructions on redeeming a complimentary NYTimes.com subscription.

- On-campus, click the linked word, **here**
- Off campus, click the **Go** button and you'll be directed through the library's proxy. Login with your usual credentials.

Once you set up an account, you will not need to login via the proxy again.

## **Changes to Kanopy**


Thanks to a new agreement with Kanopy, access to content on the Kanopy site will no longer be restricted in any manner. Users will no longer encounter messages explaining that a film is not currently available at the USA Libraries, and they will not need to make requests for Kanopy titles as all titles should be available.

## Voter Registration Drive held on February 10th, 2020



In 1920, the 19<sup>th</sup> Amendment of the U.S. Constitution was ratified giving women the right to vote. The League of Women Voters was established that same year to educate women about their newly gained right, and providing unbiased voter education and participation continues to be the goal to this day. The League's mission is to encourage the informed and active participation of citizens in government, work to increase understanding of major policy issues, and influence public policy through education and advocacy. The League is nonpartisan and does not support political party candidates.

The League of Women Voters of Mobile assisted with two voter registration drives sponsored by USA Libraries. The drives were held on September 24<sup>th</sup>, National Voter Registration Day, and February 10<sup>th</sup> of this year. The League also participated in the USA MLK Week of Service and Unity by registering voters in the Student Center on January 16<sup>th</sup>. The League conducts voter registration drives at other community events throughout the year. 




## **Fill Your Water Bottle!**
