New Resource: Social Explorer

The University Libraries have added the data visualization tool, *Social Explorer*, to the resources it makes available for faculty, staff, and students. *Social Explorer* allows users to

create maps, charts, and reports to represent the data they are interested in. A variety of indicators, demography, politics, crime, and economy among them, are available. Users can also add their own data to see how that data impacts their results.

New Resources: Alabama Select Newspapers

The University Libraries have had online access to the *Mobile Press Register*, back to 1992, for years. Our access to the paper in microfilm goes back to 1821. In 2019, we began receiving older issues that we'd previously received on microfilm in a version called "digital microfilm;" everything we'd previously obtained on microfilm began being available in this format in 2019, with a 90-day embargo. The most recent change to our access to the *Mobile Press Register* comes with the Libraries' acquisition of the *Alabama Select* newspaper archive from Readex. This product provides access to the *Mobile Register* from 1833-1870 and to 27 other historical Alabama papers with varying coverage dates.

Why was the scholarship created?

The John F. Gray Memorial Scholarship was created in November 2020 by the Shaw High School Class of 1991. Classmates from Shaw choose to honor the memory of their beloved assistant principal, Mr. John F. Gray, on the occasion of their 30th high school class reunion, by establishing a freshman scholarship at the University of South Alabama to benefit graduates from the Mobile County Public School System who demonstrate and exemplify Mr. Gray's qualities of leadership and service to others.

Who does it benefit?

The John F. Gray Memorial Scholarship will assist incoming freshmen students who have a 3.0 or better GPA and a 24 or better ACT score. Preference will be given to students who graduate from a high school within the Mobile County Public School System and who have demonstrated leadership qualities through high school, community or service organizations.

Are matching funds available?

Yes - As part of the Mitchell-Moulton Scholarship Initiative (MMSI) at USA, gifts made towards the John F. Gray Memorial Scholarship will be matched dollar for dollar, allowing supporters to double their impact on deserving students.

What is the fundraising goal for the scholarship?

Gifts of any amount to the John F. Gray Memorial Scholarship are tax-deductible and are greatly appreciated. The \$10,000 fundraising goal was established in hopes of creating an endowment fund which would leave a legacy of scholarship support for USA students and honor Mr. Gray's memory in perpetuity. Once endowed, the principle would permanently remain in the fund and only the earned interest on the fund would be distributed as a scholarship award each year. This would allow the scholarship to be enduring.




Digitization Efforts Moving Ahead





Erik Overbey Collection Safety Negative of the film type that is beginning to deteriorate. These images tell the unique story of Mobile, Alabama.
