If you have suggestions for programs or services that AIHeLA can provide please feel free to contact a member of the Executive Committee. We are here to make your organization work for you!

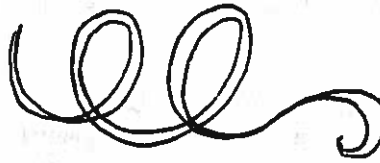
## PLAN TO ATTEND

## HEALTH SERVICES ADMINISTRATION JOURNALS AT LISTER HILL

In 1985 Lister Hill Library, UAB, was awarded a Regional Medical Library Services (Region 2) collection development grant to be used to enhance the library's holdings in health services administration (HSA). A significant portion of the award was allocated to the purchase of backfiles for new HSA subscriptions added to the library's holdings. The cost of these new subscriptions have been absorbed by the library in long-range support of the RMLS award and the needs of Alabama's health science libraries. ## ALABAMA'S PROFESSIONAL HEALTH SCIENCE JOURNALS

Health science librarians are working towards closer, more productive relationships with the health professionals served by their libraries. In part to accomplish this end, librarians develop subject expertise in the medical specialties of their clientele to complement and extend the technical skills of librarianship.

In today's high-pressure, fast-moving health arena, subject expertise and technical skills are not enough. With reduced budgets and demands for increased services, librarians need to know about the politics and pressures exerted on the health professions so that the library may prosper. A better understanding of the political and economic environment of the health care field will enable the librarian to communicate with patrons more effectively and to market the library and its information services more efficiently.

Journals and newsletters issued by the professional associations of medical specialists provide one avenue for increasing awareness of political process in the health sciences. An annotated list of journals and newsletters issued by Alabama's professional health associations follows. Several state health department publications are also included. Not listed, but also valuable sources of information, are the house organs and public relations newsletters of hospitals and medical centers and the newsletters of UAB's Lister Hill Library and the USA Biomedical Library. Additions to the list are welcomed.

Alabama Dentist. Bimonthly newsletter published by the Alabama Dental Foundation, 836 Washington Avenue, Montgomery, AL 36104. The newsletter reports on legislation, reimbursement practices, classified advertisements, local and national meetings, and includes obituaries.

Alabama Family Physician. This slim journal is published monthly by the Alabama Chapter of the American Academy of Family Physicians, 19 South Jackson Street, Montgomery, AL 36197. It contains reviews of legislation, editorials, University of Alabama Medical Center news, convention reports, and advertisements.

Alabama Journal of Medical Sciences. The Medical Center at the University of Alabama at Birmingham, University Station, Birmingham, AL 35294, publishes this journal quarterly at a subscription price of \$15 annually. AJMS publishes "original articles, case reports, topical reviews, editorials, book reviews, correspondence, and medical news in the broad field of the health sciences." The journal has a regular column "Lister Hill Library: Collections and Services."

Alabama Medicine. This is the official journal of the Medical Association of the State of Alabama, P. O. Box 1900-C, Montgomery, AL 36197-4201. The subscription price is \$30 for 12 monthly issues. Included are editorials, case reports, practice management articles, book reviews, and classified

advertisements. Until 1983, Alabama Medicine was known as Journal of the Medical Association of the State of Alabama.

Alabama Nurse. This annual journal is the official publication of the Alabama State Nurses' Association, 360 N. Hull Street, Montgomery, AL 36197. The purpose of ASNA is to "foster high standards of nursing practice, promote the professional and education advancement of nurses..." AN promotes these goals and others on the local level by providing a forum for education, conference reports, announcements of standards, and association planning.

Alabama's Health. This monthly newsletter is the official publication of the Alabama Department of Public Health, Special Services Administration, Bureau of Primary Prevention. Brief public health and safety articles educate and inform the reader. Alabama's Health has brief biographies of new state Department of Public Health employees and clendars of upcoming health education events across the state.

Alabama Abstract. This bimonthly publication is issued by the Alabama Medical Records Association (Annette Stewart, ART, Editor, Medical Records Department, St. Vincent's Hospital, Birmingham, AL 35205). It is available to nonmembers for \$7 annually. The newsletter carries association business, programs of meetings and continuing education seminars, and job advertisements. AlaMRA has an Ad Hoc Committee on Building Alliances with Other Health Care Organizations.

Awareness. This bimonthly (varies) newsletter is published by the Division of Mental Illness and Substance Abuse Community Programs, Alabama State Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation, 200 Interstate Park Drive, P. O. Box 3710, Montgomery, AL 36193-5001. It contains news of national state, local and privately organized substance abuse programs, focusing on education, prevention, and treatment. It also contains listings of free or inexpensive publication issued by the division.

Journal of the Alabama Academy of Science. The Alabama Academy of Science is affiliated with the American Association for the Advancement of Science, and is issued out of the office of the JAAS Editorial Board Chairman, J. T. Bradley, Department of Zoology-Entomology, Auburn University, Auburn, AL 36839. Publication in the journal is restricted to members of the Academy. Articles are scholarly, refereed and in the areas of the pure and applied sciences and the social and behavioral sciences. A recent issue had several pieces on nursing.

Journal of the Alabama Dental Association. This substantial journal is published quarterly by the Alabama Dental Association, 836 Washington Avenue, Montgomery, AL 36104 and is available for \$12 annually. A recent issue contained an original article, a case study, interviews, and reports of awards to outstanding local practitioners. There are regular columns, reports on the Alabama Dental Assistants Association and the Alabama Dental Hygenists' Association. The summer 1985 issue carried an impressive obituary of Senator Lister Hill and featured the Lister Hill Library on its cover.

Profiles. The Alabama Hospital Association (500 N. East Blvd., Montgomery, AL) distributes this publication monthly to members of the Association. Individual membership to AlaHA is \$10. Institutional membership to AlaHA is \$100 and includes a weekly news digest of legislation and political action affecting Alabama's hospitals.

Rare Foci. "This newsletter is published monthly by the Alabama Optometric Association to inform its members of newsworthy events." Rare Foci includes practice management notes, calendars of events, briefs on members in the news, and reports on legislation affecting optometry in Alabama.

The American Board of Medical Specialties (ABMS) has recently announced plans to publish the first biennial edition of the ABMS Compendium of Certified Medical Specialists in the spring of 1986. Alexis Rodgers, ABMS Operations Director, reports that the ABMS is no longer contracting with Marquis to publish the Directory of Medical Specialists. An ABMS publicity flyer for the Compendium states that "the ABMS no longer authorizes the publication of any other directory containing biographies of board certified medical specialists". However, the preface to the Directory of Medical Specialists, 22nd edition, states that information on certification is obtained directly from the individual specialty boards and not from the ABMS. A closer examination of both publications will be required to assess the currentness and accuracy of the data and to determine whether all specialty boards contributed and will continue to contribute to the Directory of Medical Specialists.

The seven volume ABMS Compendium of Certified Medical Specialists will be published in alternate years to the Directory of Medical Specialists. Until April 30, 1986, it is available at a pre-publication price of \$180. After April 30, 1986, the Compendium will be \$200 plus postage and handling.

## COPYRIGHT COMPLIANCE GUIDELINES

The value and importance of maintaining lists of journals requested on interlibrary loan was raised at the December 6, 1985 ABULS participants meeting. These lists enable each borrowing library to monitor the frequency of titles requested for loan, information necessary for compliance with the copyright law. Additionally, the lists are useful for collection development, as a record of the scope and variety of journals required by patrons of the library. Participants attending the December 1985 meeting agreed to maintain copyright lists, and to forward copies to the coordinators on a quarterly basis. The list is easy to compile, with the cumulative number of requests for each title for that year in the left column, and the journal titles in the right column. The list is begun anew at the beginning of each year. A discussion of copyright compliance follows.

The borrowing library is responsible for insuring that an interlibrary loan request complies with the Copyright Law and the accompanying guidelines. The guidelines restricts copying in such quantities which would substitute for a subscription to or purchase of a work. To assure the lending library that there is compliance, the requesting library must check one of the two compliance code boxes in the lower left-hand corner of the ALA-approved standard interlibrary loan form. Many libraries, including the National Library of Medicine, will not fill interlibrary loan requests unless copyright compliance is indicated.

"CCG" (Complies with Copyright Guidelines) means that the interlibrary loan request is for a journal with a publication date within the last five years and the request meets one of the following criteria: (1) during the present year, there have been no more than five requests for articles from that journal title, for the last five years by publication date; (2) a subscription to the journal has been ordered; (3) the library has a subscription, but the needed issue is missing, damaged or at the bindery.

"CCL" (Complies with Copyright Law) primarily means that the journal photocopy or loan request is for material older than the previous five years and that the request observes principles of fair use.
