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NEW CAMPUS SITE OF BIOMEDICAL LIBRARY OPENS

The campus site of the Biomedical Library opened at its new location adjacent to the College of Medicine on December 21, 1992. The Biomedical Library Building represents a 325% increase in overall space and a 471% increase in user seating capacity. Included in the Library are eight individual study rooms, seven group study rooms and the College of Medicine microcomputer lab. Now in its own building, the Biomedical Library campus site can set hours of operation more suitable for the faculty, staff and students of the Colleges of Medicine, Allied Health Professions, and Nursing. See box below for the hours of operation. Both BML sites will maintain regular hours during the U.S.A. quarter breaks.

NEW SERVICES ADDED

As part of the USA Biomedical Library's effort to improve and expand services, two new services are being offered. Patrons may have any journal citation verified through an online database for the cost of the search plus a nominal fee based on their university affiliation and organizational structure. Patrons affiliated with USA, such as faculty, staff and students pay the cost of the search plus \$2.00. Non-profit organizations and area health care professionals pay the cost plus \$2.50. Other organizations and unaffiliated individuals pay the cost plus \$3.00.

The Biomedical Library is also introducing a photocopy service for journal articles in its collection. Those patrons affiliated with USA pay \$2.00 per article if they pick the photocopy up or have it mailed to them, and \$3.00 to have an article faxed to their office. Articles or journals ordered through our inhouse system will continue to be free to these patrons. For the second category, non-profit organizations and area health care professionals, the charges are \$7.00 for pick-up/mail and \$9.00 for faxing. Other organizations and individuals pay \$10.00 for pick-up/mail and \$13.00 for faxing.

Requests for both of the above services will be taken in person or by phone, mail or fax at either location of the Biomedical Library. See above box for telephone and fax numbers for each site.

NURSING BOOKS AND JOURNALS MOVED TO BML CAMPUS SITE

With the advice of the Dean and faculty of the College of Nursing, journals and books at the UMC site which support the CON curricula were moved to the new campus site. Consolidating all nursing titles at the new BML campus site should lessen confusion as to where materials are located and provide a more spacious environment for research and study. Duplicate copies of the most heavily used journals supporting clinical nursing practice are still available at the UMC site. Nursing books and journals are now be shelved with other materials and are not maintained as a separate collection.

NEW PHOTOCOPY EQUIPMENT

The Biomedical Library has new photocopier machines at both the Campus and UMC sites. The copiers are significantly superior to the previous machines:

- designed especially for copying books and journals, which is less stressing to the bindings
- reduce or enlarge the images copied
- accept one-dollar and five-dollar bills
- accept coins
- accept copicards issued by Biomedical Library

We increased the number of machines to three at each site. These heavy duty machines are more reliable and versatile than the equipment they replace.

To make this improved service more cost effective, the cost per copy increases from \$.05 to \$.10. Copicards purchased at the rate of \$.05 will remain valid until entirely depleted. New copicards or revalued copicards can be purchased at the \$.10 per copy rate.

NAC ONLINE

NAC Online is the computerized information network of the CDC's National AIDS Clearinghouse, containing information about AIDS- and HIV-related issues. The network includes MMWR and the AIDS Daily Summary as well as other databases that report on conferences, available funding, organizations, treatment and clinical trials, and educational materials. There is no charge to search this system and it is available at both sites of the Biomedical Library. See a Reference Librarian.
