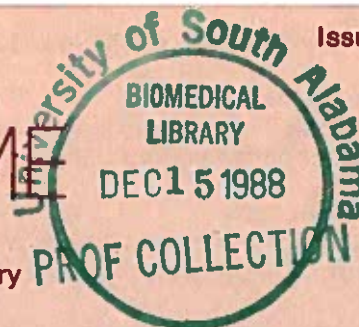

## DIAL ACCESS TO LUIS

During Spring Quarter, 1988, the University Libraries' online card catalog, LUIS, became available through dial-up access. LUIS is accessible via most pc's and terminals, as well as through Gandalf. ## GRATEFUL MED

Grateful Med is the name of IBM compatible software used for performing database searches on Medline. The reference librarians will assist patrons by providing information on doing one's own Medline searching, by copying Grateful Med to two floppy disks provided by patrons and by helping with specific searches after a searching password has been received. ## UNIFORM REQUIREMENTS FOR MANUSCRIPTS

The International Committee of Medical Journal Editors has issued the revised "Uniform Requirements for Manuscripts Submitted to Biomedical Journals." Over 300 journals (listed therein) have agreed to accept manuscripts prepared in accordance with these style requirements. If authors prepare their manuscripts in the specified manner, the editors of the participating journals will not return manuscripts for changes in details of style. This is advantageous because it eliminates the need to rewrite submitted papers not initially accepted before submitting to another participating journal.

The "Requirements" were published in the February 1988 issue of the *Annals of Internal Medicine* and the February 6, 1988 issue of the *British Medical Journal*. Single reprint booklets may be obtained by sending a stamped self-addressed envelope to Circulation Manager, *Annals of Internal Medicine*, 4200 Pine Street, Philadelphia, PA 19104. Reprints in bulk may be purchased.
