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## ONLINE SEARCHING AT THE BIOMEDICAL LIBRARY

### WHAT IS AN ONLINE SEARCH?

An online literature search is a search through a database consisting of article titles, authors, journal citations (date, issue, page numbers), and other data resulting in retrieval of a bibliography on a given subject or of articles by a given author.

In order to understand what a literature search can do for you, it is necessary to be aware of the printed indexes and abstracts that correspond to the electronic versions (databases). The printed indexes probably of primary interest to you, such as Index Medicus, Hospital Literature Index, and Cumulative Index to Nursing and Allied Health Literature, are available for use in both locations of the Biomedical Library. The electronic versions are also accessible at both locations of the Biomedical Library via terminals linked by long distance telecommunication systems to New York or Maryland (headquarters for the BRS and National Library of Medicine searching services).

The electronic versions (databases) of the printed indexes mentioned above, plus hundreds of others, make the same information accessible to you as their print counterparts, but by virtue of the nature of the medium, databases allow for additional access points and the cumulation of publication dates into one massive file (as opposed to the year by year searching requirements of a print index). In most cases, the print indexes are produced by downloading from the databases themselves.

### STEPS TO A SUCCESSFUL SEARCH

1. Peruse the print index to see if what you want is readily accessible through the print copy.
2. Communicate your request in lay terms to the searcher.
3. Assist searcher in determining appropriate subject headings.
4. Be present for your search so you can give on-the-spot feedback to the searcher regarding subject matter and relevancy rate. (Make an appointment if at all possible -- you will benefit from an unrushed session with the searcher.)

### PARAMETERS (YOURS AND OURS)

You may want to limit your search by any of the following parameters:

1. Language of article
2. Age group of subjects (infants, adolescents, adults, etc.)
3. Human or animal studies

We may limit your search by the following parameters:

1. Normally we will not print abstracts online (we will print them offline and they will arrive by U.S. mail in 5-7 days).
2. Please, no more than 100 citations printed online (we will print them offline and they will arrive by U.S. mail in 5-7 days).

## WHO CAN RECEIVE AN ONLINE LITERATURE SEARCH?

Those eligible to receive FREE online literature searches include:

1. Faculty -- Colleges of Medicine, Nursing, Allied Health Professions
2. Graduate Students -- Colleges of Medicine (Ph.D.), Nursing, Allied Health Professions
3. Research Assistants -- Colleges of Medicine, Nursing, Allied Health Professions
4. House Staff
5. Medical Center Department Heads
6. Medical Students, Third and Fourth Year

Other USA affiliated personnel and students may receive a search, but must pay the same cost as will be billed to us from the database vendor.

(Sample below) Blank forms are located at the Circulation Desk. Please fill out a form for each item to be brought from storage.

We will make 1 trip a day, Monday - Friday, to offsite storage. Patrons will be notified when the material is available at the Campus Library. Since there are occasions when the material is not immediately available, please do not come to the Library to pick up material until you are contacted. Upon retrieval from storage the material will be kept at the Campus Library Circulation Desk for 5 days after the patron has been notified and then returned to storage.

Medical Center Library patrons should go through the usual inhouse request process to order storage items.

# HOW TO SPEED UP YOUR INTERLIBRARY LOAN

The Biomedical Library Interlibrary Loan (ILL) Department borrows approximately 2800 items for USA patrons each year. For each request we must:

1. Double check to make sure that the item is not owned by the USA Libraries.
2. Check that the patron is eligible for ILLs.
3. Verify that the article actually exists.
4. Identify other libraries that own the item.
5. Request the material from another library.

This is a time consuming process. You can help us yourself by carefully filling out each section of the request form. Since we need all of the information on the form to order materials, we must fill in the information that you do not put on the form. We process the requests that are correctly filled out first. The others are put aside until we have time to work on them.
