MAJOR CHANGES AT THE MEDICAL CENTER LIBRARY!

Each year a large amount of material disappears from the Medical Center Library's collection. This loss of books and journals means that funds which should be spent on new titles to expand the collection must be used for "replacement" copies. In addition, the missing material, usually that in the heaviest demand, is unavailable during the replacement period. In an effort to reduce the Library's losses and thereby improve its service, two major changes have been made at the Medical Center Library.

A 3M book detection system was installed on June 1, 1984. Under this system, library materials not in circulation are "sensitized" to activate an electronic detector. Materials are deactivated during the checkout procedure, which will not be slowed by the process. If a patron attempts to leave with material which has not been properly checked out, an audible signal is given and the exit gate locks.

Effective June 1, the Library will be closed when it is unstaffed. The following schedule gives the hours when the library will be open. Holiday schedules will be posted as appropriate.

SPOTLIGHT ON: PATS

PATS is a database containing citations and abstracts for U.S. patents issued in all technological categories by the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office. Included are utility patents, reissue patents and defensive publications. The database can be searched by basic information such as patent number, inventor, application data, cited patents, etc. Subject access to the patents is gained by textword searches of the titles and abstracts. PATS which is produced by the Bibliographic Retrieval Service covers 1975 to the present and is updated weekly. For further information, call Judy Johnston, 460-7043.

REFERENCE NOTES

ARE YOU FINDING WHAT YOU WANT IN LUIS?

LUIS (the USA Libraries online catalog) has been in operation for nearly a year. Although many people use LUIS, it appears that there is still not a general understanding of the scope of the online catalog.

LUIS contains records for all books cataloged by the University Library since 1975 and by the Biomedical Library since August 1981, or about 65,000 titles. For nearly 100,000 books, the only access at present is through the card catalog. The Libraries are presently engaged in a project to convert records for these items to the online catalog. We hope to have entries for the majority of these titles in LUIS by the end of this year.

LUIS also contains information about journals and other serials (annuals, etc.) held by the University Library and the Biomedical Library. You can find out if the Library owns back volumes of a journal as well as see which is the latest issue received as soon as it has been checked in.

The serials printouts for both libraries have not been updated in several years, so should be regarded as nonauthoritative, but probably helpful if the cataloging information for a particular title seems confusing. Review of cataloging for all journals has not yet been completed. These records were obtained from two national cataloging databases. Changes in cataloging data are necessary in many instances to correct erroneous information (or lack of information) about title changes or to add or delete subject headings.

LUIS does not index journal articles or chapters in books. Use Index Medicus or online databases for these materials.

Basically, remember to 1) check the card catalog if you don't find what you need in LUIS, 2) consult subject headings lists (MeSH or the red library of Congress book) to make certain you are using a valid heading, 3) ask for help if you don't find what you need.

ANA/NLM PUBLICATIONS

The publications of the American Nurses' Association and the National League for Nursing are an important part of the nursing literature. Because there are so many of them and they are published so irregularly, the Biomedical Library has placed a standing order with both associations to secure all of their publications.

The publications vary in size and format so the Biomedical Library houses them in several places. Those that are not pamphlets or ephemera are usually given a call number and placed in the circulating collection. These circulate the same length of time as books. The others are filed by ANA or NLN publication number [ANA Publ (D-61), NLN Publ (15-1680)] in the Verticle File behind the Circulation Desk and do not circulate.

Some of the publications are indexed in the Cumulative Index to Nursing and Allied Health Literature (CINAHL) and the International Nursing Index (INI). The citations include the ANA or NLN publication number. When the publications are processed, this publication number is entered into the NOTIS system along with the other bibliographic information for each publication. Not all of the publications in the collection have been entered onto NOTIS yet, but they are part of the collections which will be added to the database as time and money become available. Do not hesitate to ask for help in finding these publications!
