The Biomedical Library would like to express a warm wish for a happy and productive new year to all faculty, staff and students of the University of South Alabama.

LIBRARY NEWS

The Biomedical Library has recently added three new subcontractors to its Bibliographic Retrieval Services (BRS) network: the Office of Sponsored Programs of the University of South Alabama, the U.S.A. College of Education and the Alabama Public Library Service in Montgomery. The BRS system makes numerous computerized bibliographic retrieval data bases available on-line to its subscribers. The Biomedical Library also has two continuing subcontracts with the Science Library at Auburn University and the Lister Hill Library of the Health Sciences of the University of Alabama in Birmingham.

The National Library of Medicine has approved grant funding for the Alabama Hospital Association to develop improvements in educational resources throughout the hospitals in the state of Alabama. Marcia Davidoff has been asked by the Alabama Hospital Association to sit on the Board of Advisors for this grant.

ONLINE SERVICES

Research Projects Data Bases

Information about current research projects is available through several online data bases at the Biomedical Library. The Biomedical Library subscribes to two retrieval services, the National Library of Medicine (NLM) and Bibliographic Retrieval Services (BRS), each of which has recently acquired one such research project data base. NLM provides the RPROJ base which covers epidemiological research concerning the safety of food, drugs, and other consumer products. BRS can now provide access to the Smithsonian Science Information Exchange (SSIE), which is a data base composed of current projects which cover basic and applied research in all areas of life.

Science Citation Index Online

Beginning in 1980, SCIENCE CITATION INDEX will be available online at the Biomedical Library through BRS. The data base tapes available for interactive searching will cover the years 1978 through the current year. This data base will be particularly valuable, as SCIENCE CITATION INDEX is unsurpassed for tracing an author's work, subsequent discussions in the literature of a particular published article or book, descriptions of a method or process being used in a particular field, or critiques and modification of an original work.
