





### What is Graphic Medicine?


Graphic medicine is the combination of graphic form and medical information

This means telling medical stories using the techniques used in comics -- graphics, minimal text, panels, etc.

### What is Graphic Medicine?

Graphic Medicine is not a purely academic area. While many medical graphic novels are written by medical personnel, this isn't always the case.

Medical Graphic novels can be written by doctors, patients, family members, or others and do not have to be professionally illustrated



#### How do the arts and humanities connect with medical education?

Doctors learn how to treat the body, but there's more to medicine than fixing broken bones and headaches. Bedside manner, communicating with patients, and empathy are all important parts of being a physician. Participation in the arts helps foster and build empathy (awareness of others' feelings) and creates better doctors.

How do the arts and humanities connect with medical education?

"A sound soul dwells within a sound mind and a sound body".

Several medical schools have realized that in order to create well-rounded doctors, they need to introduce the humanities -- art, history, dance, etc. Yale Medical School has a Program for Humanities in Medicine and Cedars-Sinai has a Center for the Arts and Humanities in Medicine.

Graphic medicine is only one aspect of using the arts and humanities with science and medicine, but it is the one with the most frequent and obvious uses


## Art and Science in the Real World

Graphic Medicine comes in formats like medical comics and graphic novels. Due to the accessibility of the format, you've probably interacted with a form of graphic medicine, called graphic public health, without even realizing it.

### How does Graphic Medicine Work?

Graphic Medical novels can come in book form, like Cells at Work! or Radium Girls, or they can be in shorter form like the comics that accompany news articles.




