Dr. Elias Chalhub earned his medical degree from Emory University in Atlanta, Ga. He completed his internship at the University of North Carolina at North Carolina Memorial Hospital in Chapel Hill, N.C. He then completed a National Institute of Neurological Disorders and Stroke (NINDS) special fellow in pediatrics, clinical neurology and child neurology at Washington University School of Medicine in St. Louis, Mo.

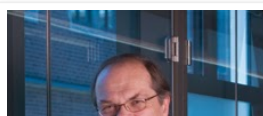

The lecture, titled "Mechanical Signaling in Cells and Tissues," was given on January 15, 2014, at 4 p.m. in the first floor auditorium of the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai on USA's main campus.


Dr. Janmey's lab studies several aspects of cell mechanobiology.



Dr. Janmey earned his A.B. degree in chemistry and philosophy from Oberlin College in 1976 and his Ph.D. in physical chemistry from the University of Wisconsin in 1982. He was a research fellow in the department of chemistry at the University of Wisconsin and in the hematology-oncology unit at Massachusetts General Hospital.
